ALUMNI PROFILE

Following the Winding Road of Life

Bill Rother '55 Says "Life's Been Good to Me"

At 73 years old, **William O. Rother '55** (Otto) is launching a new career: that of singer-songwriter. His first CD is titled *Life's Been Good to Me*, which could be the theme for Bill's life. He is a man who has followed his heart and his talent and looks back on the past 50 years with satisfaction.



Following his dreams has taken Bill on a winding path, as exemplified by the fact that his undergraduate degree from Penn State is in Forestry, but he's never worked in that profession. He played banjo with a Dixieland band while a student at Penn State and, on the very day he was discharged from the Army, began playing professionally.

"In the morning, I was training recruits at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. That night, I was on the stage at Madison Square Garden, playing for [Dwight] Eisenhower," he recalls. It was 1956, and Eisenhower was in the midst of his second run for the presidency. "In order to join the [musician's] union, I had to prove that I had lived at least a year in New York and could read music. I couldn't do either, but they told me Mr. Waring said I was in." The "Mr.

Waring" who vouched for him was fellow Penn State alumnus Fred Waring, of Fred Waring & The Pennsylvanians, the popular musical group.

Bill continued to perform with the group for several years, including appearances on the *Ed Sullivan Show*, the *Jackie Gleason Show* and the *Perry Como Show*. Then his life took another turn when he decided to produce a television series about Grand Prix auto racing. It was going to be produced in London, so he became a tour director with Tauck Tours so he'd have an affordable way to get there. He later left to work on the show.

"I spent a year in Europe and wound up with no money," Bill says. "Tauck took me back, and 40 years later I retired as vice president." During those 40 years, he visited 120 countries.

Following his retirement from Tauck, Bill became an enrichment lecturer for Celebrity Cruise Lines. His bio says he has played for a "president, a queen and a king": President Eisenhower, Queen Elizabeth II and the King of Rock n' Roll, Elvis (Bill played the guitar during the

making of Elvis's movie *Blue Hawaii*.) Bill estimates he's lectured on 22 cruises in the past five years, mostly to Hawaii and Alaska, but also several countries around the world.

The next turn in Bill's journey came a few years ago when he agreed to become the road manager for José Feliciano, the international recording star.

The House will be closed for safety reasons during the summer as we upgrade the sprinkler system and perform some indoor and outdoor renovations. The parking lot will also be closed.





New Curtains, Ice Machine, Sprinkler System and More

We are pleased to announce the addition of brand new, high quality, fire-resistant gold curtains to the club room, dining room and brotherhood

stairs. These are the first new curtains in over 20 years. These heavy duty curtains have the easy-to-open and-close hardware similar to hotel rooms and offer additional privacy and security to the House.

We have also added a new ice machine. With double the ice-making capacity of the old maker, this new machine is winning rave reviews from the actives.

A sprinkler system upgrade has begun and will continue throughout the summer, upgrading the sprinkler heads and increasing the area covered by the sprinkler system to keep us current with new fire codes.

Weekly Walk-Thru Inspections and a landscaper were added also this year. Through the Fraternity Purchasing Association (FPA), we have now contracted for weekly walk-through inspections that help identify hazards or new damages and quickly fix or correct the situation. In addition, a landscape company will be cutting the lawn this summer to help maintain the appearance of the property.

We hired a "litter patrol" to sweep the property four times a week, making sure that all beverage cans, paper plates, etc. are picked up and discarded. This litter patrol serves as a backup to the actives, who are still responsible for keeping the property clean.

Kappa Alpha Order continues to lease the House from us. There were roughly 35 KAs living in the House this spring, and they plan to have over 40 living in the House next year. Congrats to KA for raising over \$100,000 for this year's Dance Marathon!

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our Heritage Continues – from Otto Grupp III '51, President of the Corporation Great Strides Made in Recent Years Show Promise for the Future

Since the actives were removed from the House in 2001, our Alumni Corporation and PKS National Headquarters, Chester Springs, PA have maintained a positive relationship with the University and the Intra-Fraternity Council. What has

happened in the intervening years?

In 2001, we anticipated we could re-colonize in three to five years. As we began to assess the physical condition of the House and our financial position, it became apparent that a longer time commitment was necessary. We had to restructure our balance sheet, refinance

our mortgage, pay off outstanding debts and begin to match revenues against expenditures - we began a series of improvements to "save the House." Many of the recent improvements are listed in this *Psidelights*.

We give credit to the faithful brothers that never lost confidence that we would reemerge as a robust PSI Chapter. The brothers' financial support is outstanding: 1990 - \$8K from 108 brothers; 1997 - \$12K from 80 brothers; 2005 - \$15k from 128 brothers. We will continue to hold regional meetings and hope to have

more groups meet such as organized by Sam Curry '62 in NC that gathered 35 brothers and their ladies from the '58 – '64 classes.

Perhaps the most significant *Psidelights* was October 1990 — the 100th Anniversary edition — which discussed our history as the first fraternity at Penn State, initially organized as the QTV Society in 1884. With this heritage, how can we not put forth every possible effort to open our House doors in the near future? In the next *Psidelights*, we will update our countdown plans for the re-colonization.
