New Alumni President Sets His Sights on Building a Better Phi Kap

Mark Bokelman '82 has big shoes to fill, stepping in as president of Penn State Skull House after Otto Grupp's 12-year term. But Mark, a resident of Collegeville, Pa., has his sights set on finishing what we've set out to do and building a better Phi Kap at Penn State.

Why did you decide to run for election to lead the alumni association?

That's an easy one - because Otto asked me if I would be interested in placing my name on the ballot. How could I say no?

What are some challenges you face, and how do you plan to overcome them?

The only real challenge I foresee is following Otto Grupp. Otto's vision and leadership have proved invaluable in recolonizing the Chapter and raising monies towards the Capital Campaign. I hope I can do him proud.

What are your goals as president, and how do you plan to achieve them?

One goal is to finish what we started and reach our goal of raising \$1,000,000 for the Capital Campaign. Thanks to the generosity of about 25% our alumni base, we've raised almost \$800,000 to date. I don't see why we can't raise another

\$200,000 or more. I believe it's a worthy cause - thinking back, unbeknownst to me when I rushed the house, the house may not have existed in 1978 without J. Orvis Keller's generosity during the Depression. Thinking about that, I probably wouldn't have the same life-long friends that I have today. I recognize that everyone has different priorities, but if you have not yet made a pledge and have the means to give, I ask that you give it some strong consideration.

Another goal of equal importance, is working with the Board and the actives to increase the number of brothers living in the House. We're trending in the right direction, and I'd like to see us back to full capacity in the near future. I welcome ideas on how to get there.

Also, I've been kicking around the idea of organizing some informal get-togethers with the alums in Philly, the Burgh, etc., along with some hosted events at the House.

Why would you encourage brothers to get involved in their alumni years?

I encourage everyone to get involved. Frankly, the easiest way is to write a check towards the capital campaign. Stop by the House when you are in State College and talk to the actives. Add or update your

profile on **www.psuskull.com** to stay informed and keep in touch. Volunteer to lend a hand when we conduct work weekends at the House. Take pride in your brotherhood. Remember, once a Phi Kap, always a Phi Kap.

What are your impressions of the current active chapter?

I think we have a great bunch of guys in the house. They remind me of many of the brothers I pledged and lived with at the House; a mix of scholars, athletes, leaders, and all around good guys. I am truly impressed with their enthusiasm and look forward to working with them in the future. They want to build and expand the chapter, so let's give them a hand.
