At Phi Kappa Sigma, here's what we're really doing:

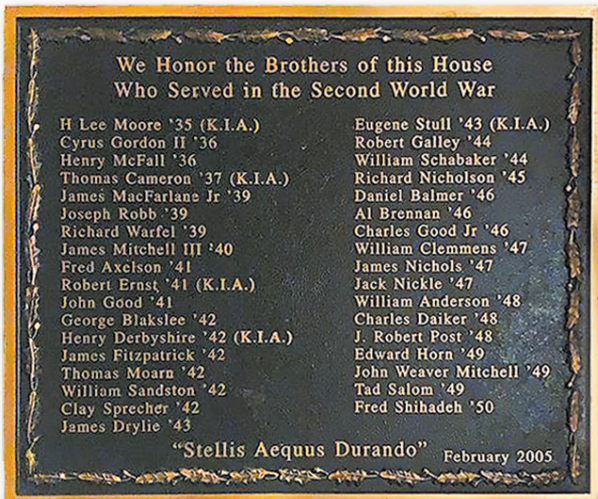
